

About Prayer: Vizio Divina

The last few weeks we have been considering Lectio Divina, or Divine Reading, as a basis for praying. By a careful and deliberate reading of a sacred text, we come into the presence of God's Word for us today. Another form of prayer, similar to Lectio Divina, and just as ancient, is nonetheless one that many people are only now coming to know: Visio Divina, or Divine Seeing.

As the name suggests, Visio Divina is a form of Christian prayer in which we allow our hearts and imaginations to enter into a sacred image, in silence, in order to see what God might be saying to us. The visible image makes the invisible reality substantially present to us.

Much of Western Art, from the 300s on to today, is based on religious and Biblical themes, so that we have a rich and varied source of images to look at prayerfully. During the Middle Ages, as the soaring Gothic cathedrals were being built with stained glass windows, scenes from the Bible and Christian imagination were presented before the people for them to look upon and pray. Our Catholic use of statues in Church is meant in the same way. Instead of adoring idols, we gaze upon an image of a saint in order to focus our minds on that saint's relationship with God as we seek help in prayer.

We will continue to look at *Visio Divina* next week.
