Today's Scripture 6th Sunday of Easter

Acts 8:5-8, 14-17 1 Peter 3:15-18 John 14:15-21

Lectio Divina

Lectio Divina is Latin term, means "divine reading" and describes a way of reading the Scriptures in which we gradually open ourselves to what God wants to say to us here and now. Its natural movement is towards greater simplicity, with less and less talking and more listening. Gradually the words of Scripture begin to dissolve, and the Word is revealed before the eyes of our heart. Lectio divina may involve discussing the implications of the Word of God for daily life but it cannot be reduced to this. The movement of the prayer is towards silence. If one is comfortable with silence, more time can be spent resting in the Word.

The practice of *Lectio divina* as a way of praying the Scriptures has been a fruitful source of growing in relationship with Christ for many centuries. In our own day it is being rediscovered by many individuals and groups. The Word of God is alive and active and will transform each of us if we open ourselves to receive what God wants to give us.

In the 12th century, a Carthusian monk called Guigo described the stages which he saw as essential to the practice of Lectio divina, namely Lectio, Meditatio, Oratio, and Contemplatio. There are various ways of practicing Lectio divina either individually or in groups, but Guigo's description remains fundamental. In the next few weeks, we will look more closely at this form of prayerful reading.
