

Today's Scripture 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Exodus 19:2-6a Romans 5:6-11 Matthew 9:36 - 10:8

The Rosary: The Mysteries of the Rosary

Sometimes Catholics are accused of multiplying words when they pray the Rosary, as the Lord Jesus warns against in Matthew 6:7 "In praving, do not babble like the pagans, who think that they will be heard because of their many words." In fact, the Rosary is a very Biblical prayer, calling us to reflect deeply on the Gospel of the Lord as we meditate on his Birth, Life, Death, and Resurrection. The whole range of Christ is covered by the four sets of the Mysteries of the Rosary. Here, the word "Mystery" does not mean a problem to be solved but refers to a deep reality and great event that has profound meaning and implications for us. Hence, we can contemplate the Mysteries of the Rosary over and over.

While contemplating the Mysteries, we say 10 Hail Mary's, which become the background that brings the current Mystery into sharper focus. Even the Hail Mary is a very Biblical prayer. The first part is taken from the words which the Archangel Gabriel uses to greet Mary, and then from the words that Elizabeth proclaims upon receiving Mary into her home. The second part reflects the Church's beliefs that Mary is the Mother of God and that we are all united in prayer as part of the Communion of Saints.

So, while saying with our lips the Hail Mary, we can ponder the Mysteries of the Rosary in our minds. Next week we will consider a specific way of praying the Mysteries.

Is the Parish Council **Calling You?**

The Parish Council has been thought of as the Church's best kept secret. You know they meet once a month because it is announced in the bulletin and in Church by the Lector. They must have something to do if they get together that often, but what? Who sits on the Council? Who do they answer to? These are all valid questions. They have valid answers.

The Parish Council is made up of representatives of the parish. Council members are appointed by the clergy with the rest of the Council members weighing Council members weighing

in. They serve a two-year term with the option of staying a third year. Out of the Council membership a Chairperson and Vice Chair are appointed. The Scribe (Secretary) is also appointed. The year(s) they spend in this leadership position does not count against their term.

To assist Fr. Paul, the Parish Council is kept in full knowledge of all that goes on in the Church — both liturgically and the day-to-day operation. You might be surprised how much *does* go on 'in the background' to keep our small parish on solid ground. And although it may seem not as important as liturgical matters, managing the 'day-to-day' operation is essential to keeping our Church home healthy and thriving.

With all this said, the Parish Council is in need of three additional members to begin a two-year term starting this September. Meetings are generally held on the second Monday of the month with communication in between if there is a need. On occasion there might be a committee formed to take on a special assignment with the leader being a Council member. Council meetings are always open to the parish.
