Joyful Mysteries: The Nativity

We return once more to the sentences that we can say before each Hail Mary so as to keep our thoughts and prayers on the meaning of the Mystery we are praying.

The Nativity

- 1. Mary and Joseph went up to Bethlehem to be enrolled in the census
- 2. While they were there, the time for her confinement was fulfilled
- 3. She gave birth to her first-born son whom she wrapped in swaddling clothes
- 4. And laid him in a manger for there was no room for them in the inn
- 5. There were shepherds in the same country, keeping night watch over their flocks
- 6. The angel of the Lord appeared to them, and they were much afraid
- 7. "Do not fear, I bring you tidings of great joy, which would be for all the people.
- 8. Today, in the City of David is born to you a child who is Savior and Redeemer.
- 9. And this shall be a sign to you: in a manger you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes."
- 10. And a host of angels appeared saying, "Glory to God in the Highest, and on earth, peace to those on whom his favor rests."
