

We have been presenting short sentences that can be said before each Hail Mary and we continue with the Sorrowful Mysteries that depict the sufferings of the Lord Jesus that frees us from sin and death. These sentences are based on the Stations of the Cross and on the traditional Seven Last Words of Christ.

- 1. Jesus is nailed to the Cross.
- 2. Father, forgive them for they know not what they are doing.
- 3. Amen, amen, I say to you, this day you will be with me in Paradise.
- 4. Woman, behold your son. Behold your mother.
- 5. My God, my God! Why have you abandoned me?
- 6. I thirst.
- 7. It is finished.
- 8. Father, into your hands I commend my Spirit.
- 9. Jesus is taken down from the Cross.
- 10. Jesus is laid in the tomb.
