

ABOUT THE LITURGY: **Shepherds**

Christmas can be a time for putting on one's best: best clothes for church, best dinner together, or best gifts. But note how the first

Christmas was celebrated: poor and marginalized man and woman in a stable, greeted by shepherds.

Shepherds are the first people invited to visit the newborn Jesus. Society considered shepherds to be on lowest rung. They had little money. Their proximity to animals rendered them virtually unclean and, therefore, most treated them as outcasts. Yet these shepherds who kept watch of the sheep on the hillside were the first to bear witness to God Incarnate, the Word made flesh.

When you look at the grand scheme of the Gospels, this all makes sense. People who are poor and lowly are exactly the people Christ came to redeem. These are the ones sent to glorify and praise God. May their witness, then and now, be an inspiration and motivation to us all.
