

Today's Scripture 1st Sunday of Advent

Isaiah 63: 16B-17, 19B, 64:2-7 1 Corinthians 1:3-9 Mark 13: 33-37

ABOUT THE LITURGY: Season of Advent

In one of his sermons, Saint Charles Borromeo (+ 1584) said, "Beloved, now is the acceptable time spoken of by the Spirit, the day of salvation, peace and reconciliation: the great season of Advent. This is the time eagerly awaited by the patriarchs and prophets, the time that holy Simeon rejoiced to see. This is the season that the church has always celebrated with special solemnity. We too should always observe it with faith and love, offering praise and thanksgiving to the Father for the mercy and love he has shown us in this mystery."

Advent as a period of patient, but active, waiting on the Lord. We await "the coming (or the return) of the Messiah ... who died and rose from the dead and is recognized as Lord and Son of God" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 840). The Catholic anticipation of Christmas celebrates Christ's human presence on earth during his life and ministry, honors his persistent physical presence in the Eucharist, and reminds us to be mindful of the Second Coming and to be watchful for the Lord's arrival.

Much of the structure and content of the dvent liturgies guide the faithful to understand the preparations God the Father took for the Incarnation. God makes everything, all the rituals and sacrifices, figures and symbols of the First Covenant to converge on Christ, announced by the prophets, longed for by the Jews and grasped by the Gentiles. (see CCC 522). Advent celebrates the past, present, and future of the Church. We remember our Jewish heritage and traditions, contemplate the Incarnation of Jesus as the Messiah, and prepare for the Second Coming as Christians.


