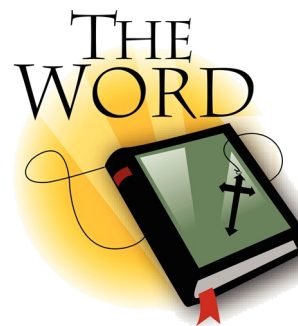

ABOUT PRAYER:

The Glorious Mysteries: The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven.

We have been presenting short sentences that can be said before each Hail Mary. We come now to the Glorious Mysteries that depict the great victory over sin and death. That victory is seen in a most special way with the Assumption of Mary, body and soul, into heaven. There are only five sentences involved with this mystery. One would say 2 Hail Mary's after each sentence.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven.

1. O Death, where is thy sting? O Grave, where is thy victory?
2. The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus.
3. Listen, oh Daughter, give ears to my words. Forget your own people and your father's house.
4. So shall the king desire your beauty. He is your lord, and you must pay homage to him.
5. The queen is led with her maiden companions. They are escorted with gladness and joy. They pass within the palace of the King.

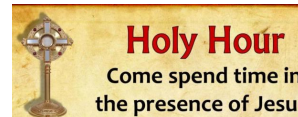

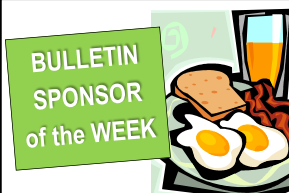
