

About The Liturgy: Called to be a Disciple

When we celebrated Christmas just a few weeks ago, we honored that moment when God came to dwell and remain with us. This concept of "*remaining, staying*," is central to the Gospel. Jesus *stays* with us, and we *stay* with Jesus. The two disciples of John ask Jesus, "Where are you *staying*?" He says to them, "Come and you will see." Then they *stay* with him all that day. By *staying* with Jesus, we learn to be his disciples.

Samuel had a direct call from God. The fact of the matter is that such clear and immediate callings are rare. For most of us, our work of discernment is long and slow. We need to sit in prayer, staying with, remaining with God in silence, and then, in the silence, hear his call within. We also need to listen and hear God at work in the people in our lives, for he calls to us through them.

Where do you struggle to hear God's voice?

What are some of the times that you've heard God's call in your life? How have you responded?

John the Baptist pointed out Jesus to Andrew and Andrew brought Simon to Jesus. Who has pointed the way to Christ for you? Who brings you closer to Jesus?

Preparing for Lent

Lent is a period of penitential preparation for Easter, and it is observed by many Christians around the world. It is a time to reflect on one's faith and make a commitment to spiritual growth. Here are some tips to help you prepare for Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14th.

Prayer: Lent is an excellent time to build virtuous habits. The Church recommends three holy practices for Catholics to embrace in penitential seasons such as Lent and Advent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. When you make your Lenten plan, choose something specific from each category. Spend at least fifteen minutes in prayer a day, and consider adding a Rosary or a Divine Mercy chaplet to your daily routine. **Fasting**: Fasting is a way to discipline the body and focus on spiritual growth. Consider fasting from food or drink for a certain period of time. You can also fast from social media, television, or other distrations that take up too much of your time.
