

Today's Scripture

2nd Sunday in Lent

Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18 Romans 8:31b-34 Mark 9:2-10

About The Liturgy: **The Lenten Mountain**

Each year this Gospel account of our Lord's transfiguration gleams like a shining jewel among the somber Scrip-

tures appointed for the early weeks of Lent. Trudging up the mountain with Jesus, the disciples could hardly have guessed what they were about to see and hear. On the silent and empty place at the top, the ordinary is transformed into something great and wondrous to behold. There, the new followers of Jesus are joined by those who sought the face of God so long before: Moses and Elijah. And then God comes to bless everything, calling it very good.

It is amazing how the powerful presence of God can appear seemingly out of nowhere. It is true that mountaintops are associated with the Holy One and have long been places of worship and prayer. Still, the disciples are amazed, even terrified at what they were seeing and hearing. Suddenly they became aware of the fullness of God all about them.

Sometimes Lent with its fasting and sacrifices may seem to be dreary, even humdrum. This Gospel passage reminds us that even in familiar times and places, God is present with power and grace. When we may think that all is drab, familiar, and even routine, by careful listening, we, too, can hear the Father's admonition for us to listen to, and follow, Jesus.

Appropriate Behavior For Mass

FAST. Do not eat any food for one hour before Mass starts. Drinking water is allowed.

COME EARLY. Allow for 10-25 minutes of meditation before Mass.

DRESS PROPERLY. Show decency in God's house.

USE HOLY WATER. Bless yourself in the sign of the cross, as a sign of your baptism, as you enter and leave the Church.

DO NOT EAT, CHEW OR DRINK. The Church is a place of prayer and reflection.

NO PHONES. Silence or turn off your cell phones. **GENUFLECT**. Kneel toward the tabernacle before you

BE SILENT. Avoid talking and take loud children to an appropriate place.

LET OTHERS SIT. Allow others to sit in your pew. **PARTICIPATE.** Sing, respond, listen, and pray.
