

### **ABOUT THE LITURGY: Participation**

Please consider these teachings about the Liturgy contained in one of the documents from the Second Vatican Council, The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium: "Rightly, then, the liturgy is considered as an exercise of the



priestly office of Jesus Christ. In the liturgy the sanctification of humanity is manifested by signs perceptible to the senses and is effected in a way which is proper to each of these signs; in the liturgy full public worship is performed by the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, that is, by the Head and His members.

"Mother Church earnestly desires · that all the faithful be led to that full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a purchased people" (1 Pet. 2:9; cf. 2:4-5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism.

"In the restoration and promotion of the sacred liturgy, this full and active participation by all the people is the aim to be considered before all else; for it is the primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian spirit. Therefore, through the needed program of instruction, pastors of souls must zealously strive to achieve it in all their pastoral work." (SC 7, 14)
