# **Today's Scripture** WORD EASTER

Acts 10:34a, 37-43 Colossians 3:1-4 John 20:1-9

## **LIVING THE LITURGY: Resurrection**

THE

"We are witnesses of all that he did," proclaimed Peter to the Christian people shortly after Jesus's resurrection. Centuries have passed since the Son of God walked the earth - yet we remain witnesses of Christ today. Christ's victory remains just as powerful in this moment in history as it did 2,000 years ago.

One of the early controversies of the church was whether Christ was God in some human form, or a very good human being, or fully both. As Catholics, we believe in the last assertion: Jesus is both fully human and fully divine. Saint Gregory of Nazianzus first proposed, "That which is not assumed is not redeemed," meaning any aspect of humanity that was not shared by Jesus is not saved by Jesus's resurrection. Everything that is part of our human nature, Jesus also had, and offered on the cross as he died.

As we celebrate Easter Sunday, our Catholic faith makes a scandalous claim: God became human, and that human being died. God died containing all of humanity: joys, sorrows, friendships, family, worries, anticipations for the future, and desires to do what is good. And as Jesus died and rose, all humans are saved.

The disciples in the gospel reading today do not encounter the risen Jesus but rather see hints of what has happened. What hints and whispers of the resurrection do you see in your own life?
