LIVING THE LITURGY: **The Peace of Divine Mercy Sunday**



In 2000, Pope John Paul II declared that the 2nd Sunday of Easter be called Divine Mercy Sunday. While the entire season of Lent has been about God's mercy and forgiveness, it receives a special emphasis as we look at how Jesus interacted with those who doubted the reality of the Resurrection.

Often Thomas is dismissed for not believing what the others tell him about Jesus, but in reality, we are more like him. Despite our declared faith, even now we still need to be convinced that the mercy of the Risen One is with us and all around us, all the time. The true pledge of Jesus's mercy is his gift of peace. Standing before the frightened disciples with all his scars

and with the marks of the cross on his hands and side, he offers peace. His peace does not promise the absence of fear, violence, or suffering. Rather, it is a promise of wholeness and fulfillment, assurance of the divine presence always and everywhere. Peace with us wherever we go. Peace in our darkest hours. Peace with us when we are feeling most alone. Peace with us in the face of death. Peace with us because he is with us.
