

Today's Scripture 7th Sunday of Easter

Acts 1:15-17, 20a, 20c-26 1 John 4:11-16 John 17:11b-19

LIVING THE LITURGY:

Empty Time, Empty Space

These ten days between the Ascension of the Lord and Pentecost Sunday invites us into a space and time where we must rely on our trust in God. Liturgically, we are living in an in-between time, in an unknown place. Jesus has ascended into heaven, but the Holy Spirit has not yet come down upon the Church. How are we to act? Who are we to be during this time of waiting? Really, what does come next?

Doing this final week of Easter, the church calls us to trust God's abiding presence among us. Throughout the Easter Season we have focused on the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus and how he has changed the world. The celebration of the Eucharist on Sundays, the gathering as a community in prayer: these actions echo what the first members of the Church during this in-between time. As they gathered, listened, and broke bread, they knew that the Risen and Ascended Lord was with them.

The important thing is to remember how Jesus is with us even now, and the love of God is near at hand whenever we do as the first members of the Church did. We gather, listen to the Scriptures, pray, receive the Eucharist, and prepare for the time when we are sent out for the mission of the Church. In all these things, we see that God is with us always.

Recall how you spent Lent and Easter this year. Where have you seen God's kindness?

How has God called you away from sin and into freedom?

How might you offer back praise and thanks to God?
