## Today's Scripture

### 11<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Exodus 17:22-24  
2 Cor 5:6-10  
Mark 4:26-34

### LIVING THE LITURGY:

#### From Small Beginnings

As Jesus uses parables about plants in the Gospel reading today, we are reminded that God can bring about great things from tiny beginnings. A single person acting in accord with God's will and the Gospel can do great things. The stories of saints reflect this: Mother Teresa of Calcutta, Mother Francis Xavier Cabrini, Saint Paul, and Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus were all individuals who did much not because of their abilities, but because they relied on God.

Jesus makes it clear that no matter how small and simple the act may be, it can produce great fruits if it is done in accordance with the Gospel. We are invited to have deep trust that God will bring about good even from our failings and weaknesses. Sometimes we are called to act without knowing if our actions will yield fruit. We are asked to trust the great things God has in mind for us. God wishes to bring true justice and peace in our divided and conflicted world. It may seem such a tall order to us to stand up for the sake of the Gospel, but if we begin to now rely on the power of the Lord, our small efforts will make great differences.

There are many ways we can find ourselves in the parables today. We could be the farmer waiting in hope but unable to control the outcome. We could be the seeds used by God to spread the Kingdom. We could even be the birds that delight in the presence of God. Which of these images resonate with you? Why?
