## Weekly Snapshot - 6/17/24


Each week we will now be showing both income and what we paid out in expenses for the week. We are running close most weeks, but will occasionally show a surplus.

## LIVING THE LITURGY: In the Midst of the Storm

In the First Reading from the Book of job, God reminds Job that God alone has the power to calm the proud waves. The Responsorial Psalm, Psalm 107, reminds us that we proclaim a God of rescue: a God who sees people in distress and listens to their pleas. And then, the story we heard in today's Gospel Reading is quite familiar. While Jesus and his disciples were crossing the sea, Jesus lays down to rest just as a violent storm begins. The disciples panic and wake Jesus who calms the storm and asks the disciples, "Do you not yet have faith?"

Jesus' question is not meant to accuse them, but to teach them and invite them to go more deeply into growing from be afraid to having a deep and strong faith. In the same way, we, who go through many struggles, fears, anxieties, and worries about the world that surrounds us, do we have faith that God will accompany us and bring us safely through these storms? The struggles we face today are quite serious, but we already have so much evidence from the Scriptures, and from our own lives, that God will not leave us alone. Let us always keep our eyes fixed on God.

What storms have you gone through with the help of God?

When you are at your wit's end, which faith-filled person do you turn to for stability and shelter? Can you be that person for someone else?
