

Living The Liturgy: Mercy

is all too easy for us to sin.

Today's meetings remind us how shocking and radical God's mercy can be. The First Reading from the

Book of Genesis recalls the fall of Adam and Eve. Although they were banished from the garden, God continued (and continues) to extend grace and mercy to humanity time and time again. I remember hearing this story as a child and wondered: how stupid could they be! God only asked for one simple thing. Yet in a very short time I found myself in the same position,

unable to do the simple things that God asked of me. It

Psalm 130 reads, "With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption." How quickly do we forget this! When I have some falling out with someone, I usually go over again and again in my mind how I had acted perfectly well, and that the other was most clearly in the wrong. It is difficult to recognize the part I played in the situation, and even harder to accept responsibility. But when I become honest with myself, then I can accept responsibility and repent. Repentance means to *turn away* from sin and *turn toward* God and right living. While it is quite difficult to accept responsibility and apologize to the injured one, God gives me the strength.


In most cases, people respond favorably to one who apologizes for mistakes made and is sincere in repentance. So, too, is God quick to forgive us in our repentance. When we accept responsibility for sin and repent, then, "with the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption." We are all called to walk humbly with God and with those whom we serve.
