


King. And while we may think these duties as belonging only to Jesus, in truth we all share these same roles. When we were baptizesd, we were anointed even then with chrism (olive oil mixed with sweet-smelling balm) in order to take our own roles of being Priests, Regal, and Prophetic with Jesus.

Both, the Gospel reading and the First Reading today remind us that being Prophetic is not easy. The Prophet speaks for God and proclaims the Word of the Lord. The Prophet reveals what God desires from us. In many cases in the Old Testament, the Prophet denounced the lack of justice for the pure and weak, and disparaged the important people for being self-satisfied and smug. Prophets were usually not welcomed!

United to Christ and sharing in his mission of being a Prophet to the nations, each of us is called by God to put our unique gifts to the service of others. The message that Jesus preached to the people of Nazareth is a radical one and it seems that they could not handle it. Their lak of faith made Jesus' job more difficult. Still, he persisted in preaching and teaching, healing and blessing up to his death on the Cross. Can there be any other way for us?

Often the prophets among us are seen as irrational, out of touch, and are shunned. Is there someone you have dismissed in this way, but now you can see a kernel of God's truth in their message?

How can you share now in Jesus' office of being a Prophet?


