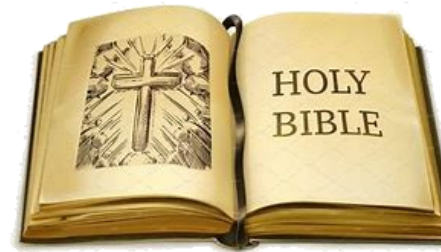

LIVING THE LITURGY: Asking for Healing



Though there is much sickness in the world, the First Reading today reminds us that such was not God's design for us. We are told, "For God formed man to be imperishable" (Wis. 2:23a). We see greater proof of God's desire to remove sickness in the healing ministry that the Lord Jesus engaged in. In the Gospel Reading today, two people, the synagogue official and the woman afflicted with hemorrhages, both come to Jesus asking for a healing. It is quite touching to see how quickly Jesus responds with care for them. He also points out that their faith has brought about the healing they sought.

The Church calls upon this healing power of the Holy Spirit in celebrating the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Before the reforms of the Second Vatican changed the name of this Sacrament, it was considered the Last Rites, and would be offered only upon the final approach of death. Today, this Sacrament of Healing and Strength is to be given in any form of sickness, weakness, or on-coming surgery.

One should not wait until the moment of death in order to ask for a priest to come and anoint a seriously ill person. Anytime during the sickness is an appropriate time to call for the priest. Anytime is the appropriate time to approach Jesus and ask for healing. It is our faith that He will save us.

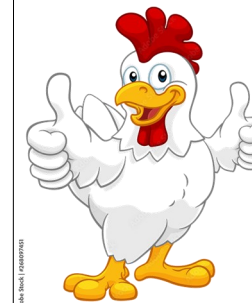
Bereavement Group Starting
