

Today's Scripture Readings

LIVING THE LITURGY:

Introducing the Eucharist


In the middle of Year B in the Lectionary, we interrupt the readings from the Gospel of Saint Mark with this section from the Gospel of Saint John. Throughout this month, the readings are taken from Chapter 6, where Jesus teaches about being the Bread of Life, the True Bread come down from heaven. Chapter 6 lays out before us the first instructions about the Holy Eucharist.

In today's Gospel Reading, Jesus makes the wild claim, "I am the Bread of Life. Whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." For us, living with 2,000 years of Christian understanding and theology, this is familiar. Of course, Jesus is bread, of course he feeds us with his Body. But for the crowd hearing it for the first time, it is weird, even horrifying. Are we to eat him??!!

The crowds went in search of Jesus because he had filled their stomachs with bread. Instead, he speaks of a food that will satisfy them for eternity. All they have to do is to believe in Jesus as the One who comes from God, feeding the world freely with his love. This message is still important for us to grasp: There is nothing we can say or do to earn God's love. God gives his love freely. We need only to open our hearts to receive it.
