

1 Kings 19:4-8 Ephesians 4:30-5:2 John 6:41-51

LIVING THE LITURGY:

Food for the Journey

Frustrated, even ready to give it all up, the prophet Elijah lays himself down in the desert. God hears his prayer for death, but answers by

sending an angel to feed him along the way. "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!" (1 Kings 19: 7b). God sends Elijah this food because he still has a mission to fulfill. This foreshadows the Eucharist, in which God feeds us and sustains us for the long pilgrimage of Christian life.

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus reminds us that he sustains us through this pilgrimage of earthly life until we can enter the fullness of God's promises. Jesus fulfills the work God did in the past for the ancient ones and surpasses that completely. While the Israelites who ate manna still died, eating this living bread will give life eternal. This was utterly mysterious and strange for Jesus's hearers. It remains mysterious for us now. Partaking in the Eucharist is a radical act of trust in the God who made us and loves us and wants abundant life for us.

Even now, like Elijah, we can find the journey of life to be too much. The message today is that God is with us on the way and sends us angels to sustain us. Truly there are angels among us who touch the suffering with a homemade meal, a letter of encouragement, an attentive ear, a word of support.
