

LIVING THE LITURGY:

Following the Law


The First Reading from Deuteronomy reminds us that Jesus' rebuke to the Pharisees and scribes is not because they were following the law. The law is a good thing; it is a gift from God intended to make us more whole. But the Pharisees and scribes observed the law in a way that did not give evidence of their wisdom; they used it not to grow closer to God but to grow more self-assured. When their inward disposition did not match their actions, their observance was no longer what God willed for them.

There are times for all of us when our inward disposition does not match what we are professing and doing at liturgy. This Gospel passage is not meant to make us feel guilty for that; many of our emotional states are beyond our full control, and God can work with them all. The important thing is to let God work; is when the Pharisees and scribes settle into their self-assurance that they grow stagnant and stop doing a good thing with their visual observances.

Do my actions help me grow closer to God?

What is in my heart that I can ask God to cleanse?

What holds me back from fully participating and sharing in the liturgy?
