

Isaiah 50:5-9a James 2:14-18 Mark 8:27-35

LIVING THE LITURGY:

Taking Up One's Cross

It is important to note that when Jesus talks in today's Gospel Reading about taking up one's cross, he is not referring to all sources of pain or hardship. Illness or disease is not the "the cross" in the sense of which Jesus speaks of. There is nothing particularly Christian about this kind of suffering: it can happen to anyone. Nor does he recommend the suffering that stems from abuse or injustice. Jesus confronted and stopped that kind of suffering whenever he encountered it.

Instead, Jesus is referring to the suffering that is likely to befall a person for being a disciple of the Lord. The cross for us is to take up are the negative and even painful consequences which Jesus' disciples willingly accept as the cost of being his follower. It is the daily choosing to place God's will and the common good at the center of one's life, in place of one's own desires. It is a freely chosen self-surrender in love. One must have a health sense of self and inner freedom in order to choose the cross. Jesus is not speaking about a suffering imposed on those who are downtrodden.

As Saint James points in the Second Reading, if one encounters a brother or sister without adequate clothing or food or shelter, then to deny oneself and take up the cross means letting go of time and recourses in self-surrender in order to help the neediest people in our midst. We are called to give freely of ourselves in a costly love.
