

LIVING THE LITURGY:

Cutting It Off

The Gospel Reading today contains some hard words; it seems to suggest that the life of a Christian is a blackand-white, all-or-nothing proposition. We know, of course, that Jesus does not really want us to remove parts of our body that cause sin. Rather, our goal is to become whole in our pursuit of holiness. We are called to tend to the hand, or the eye, or to the thoughts that cause us to sin, but we are also called to transform and convert them. Every part of us can be put into service of bringing the world closer to Christ. Every thought, every word, every deed is an opportunity to grow in our life as a Christian. It is integrity Christ wants from us, integrated lives of wholeness where every part contributes to the whole project of following Christ more closely.

This call for integrity can be seen in the traditional motto for the United states: E Pluribus Unum, which means "from the many comes one". This motto is an exhortation to embrace the common good, standing together through our diversity, and working for the welfare of all. It is a sentiment that aspires to the higher code of conduct that Jesus is asking of us in the Gospel. We are called to a lofty sense of unity grounded in compassion, humility, servitude, good judgment, and moral accountability. Integration brings wholeness and wholeness is of God.

What parts of your life needs transformation so that they might be better integrated in the service of God?

If you cut off your hand because it causes you to sin, what then happens to all the good works that the same hand has also done?

Remember that you have only one soul; that you have only one death to die; that you have only one life, which is short and has to be lived by you alone, and there is only one Glory, which is eternal. If you do this, there will be many things about which uou care nothing.


through prayer and reflection.
