

Today's Scripture Readings



Genesis 2:18-24 Hebrews 2:9-11 Mark 10:2-16

LIVING THE LITURGY:

A Suitable Partnership

"What God has joined together, no human being must separate." These words, along with words about divorce and adultery, may seem harsh coming from the Lord Jesus, but the First Reading today, from the Book of Genesis, helps us to see them in a newer light. Jesus refers to the same passage about



the creation of the world which reaches its apex in the creation of woman as the "suitable partner" of the man. The Hebrew words for "suitable partner," can also be translate as, "an indispensable help." Both ideas remind us that the union of man and woman in matrimony reflects God's original intent that all creation would be united in mutual and sacred correspondence.

Yet, Jesus' teachings about marriage can be hard to bear in a world that is still broken by sin. In this world of great complications, sometimes separation or even divorce are necessary for the safety and well-being of a spouse or the children. Instead of condemning people caught in such circumstances, the Church is called to help. We need to offer support to both, to healthy marriages, and to those, for reasons beyond our knowledge, need to live outside their marriages.

Do you know of married couple whose relationship is inspiring to you? How do they reveal God's love in this world?

What can we learn of God's love from marriage? What can we learn about marriage from the way God loves us?

But we do see Jesus, who was made lower than the angels for a little while, now crowned with glory and honor because he suffered death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. Hebrews 2:9
