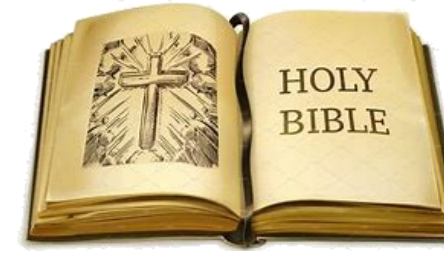

LIVING THE LITURGY:

Giving All I Have

The stories in today's readings are about faithful people giving what they can as an offering to God. In the First Reading, the widow offers what she had knowing that it was the last of her supply, putting her and her son in jeopardy. In the Gospel Reading, Christ exalts the generosity of the widow who gave all she had to God. Both showed a willingness to trust in God's care for them even to point of giving all. Both echo the supreme gift of Jesus' life on the Cross as he gave all he was for our salvation and redemption.

These acts of generosity from those who are poor remind us that the "poor" are not a passive group of people awaiting our generosity and care. People who are poor are *people*. They have families and friends. They have stories and dreams. They have callings and gifts; they are called to and capable of generosity. Any attempt we make to help should be guided by this awareness that they share the same hopes and dreams we have.

We do not know what impact our sacrifices and generosity have. Things that might seem small or meaningless are noticed by God and taken up into the greater work of bringing about God's desire for justice and love in our world.

Quite often, God provides for the poor through the work of God's people. *How might you participate in God's care for those in need?*

We must go out to Pure Life, Pure Truth, Pure Love, and that is the definition of God. He is the ultimate goal of life; from Him we came, and in Him alone do we find our peace. *Ven. Fulton J. Sheen*
