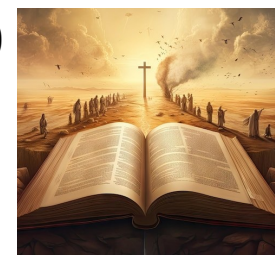

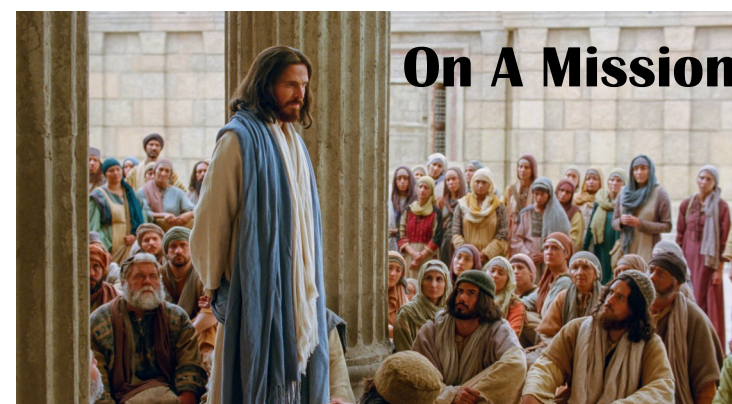
Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

LIVING THE LITURGY:



On A Mission

Wonderful things are happening in today's Gospel Reading. The Lord Jesus come to his home synagogue in Nazareth and announces what he is all about. Using the words of Isaiah the Prophet, Jesus proclaims himself to be anointed (*Christ means "The Anointed One"*) by the Holy Spirit in order to made visible and tangible the inner heart of God, who desires healing, wholeness, and jubilee justice. Jesus claims this to be his "Mission Statement." Later on, he will present the same mission to all the Church, going out throughout the world, announcing the Kingdom of God, and revealing the inner heart of God.

In the Second Reading, the Apostle Paul describes how we, the Church, continue the mission of proclaiming healing, wholeness and jubilee justice, using the image of the Holy Spirit that unifies all. The Spirit, as love in mission, creates unity and harmony within the very diverse body, where the many parts are all unique, precious, and equally important. The mission is especially focused on attending to those who are the most vulnerable. As God is united as one, so is the community of the Church: every joy felt by one is shared by all, and every suffering is borne by all.

Please also note how in the First Reading and the Gospel Reading how the assembled people listened intently to the Word of God. How often do we listen so intently at Mass? Consider how you might engage with the Scriptures outside of Mass in order to hear them more fully at Mass.
