

LIVING THE LITURGY: Forgiveness

"To err is human, but to forgive is divine," (Alexander Pope). When we are truly honest, we know well how easy it is for human beings to err and to sin. We see it in ourselves. It is easy to listen to persuasive people who invite us to share in their questionable works. It is easy to fool ourselves and rationalize that the bad thing we are planning to do is something that must be done. It is easy to give into self-righteous anger and even hurt someone. It is only human, we say.

When we are confronted with the call of Jesus to, "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you," it is also easy to retort back by saying that Jesus can do that because he is God. It is much harder, maybe even impossible, we cry, for us humans to forgive and accept our enemies. How can we ever follow Jesus' commandment?

Saint Paul provides the answer in his First Letter to the Corinthians: "Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one," (1 Cor. 15:49). Jesus came into the world to change us, transform us, and make of us a new creation. He came to complete our human nature with his own divine nature. By his grace, we are able to do what we thought impossible. In Jesus, we are forgiven and we can forgive.
