# LIVING THE LITURGY: Good Fruit

Coming now to the final Sunday before we begin the Season of Lent, the Church reminds us today that we are called by God to be like trees that bear good fruit. We are invited today to start reflecting on our lives and see what failings need to be pruned, and what virtues need to be cultivated in our hearts. Then we can enter Lent with the aim of working on both projects.

We are also cautioned by the Gospel Reading to be careful with our trust. Many voices (influencers?) clamor



out from televisions and Internet sites from all sides, claiming to direct us into a good life. Most of these are failures. Instead of the rancor, discord, hatred, anger, and name-

callings that are the fruits of evil, we are encouraged to live instead with such goodness of heart so that only good and kind speech may well up from within and pass through the lips.

All the saints agree on the need of knowing oneself honestly in order to grow in the spiritual life. Self-reflecting and introspection are two important Lenten practices that lead us to conversion and reconciliation. This work is never easy but is necessary for our souls. It is good to remember Saint Paul's advice to the Corinthians, "Be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." (1Cor: 15:58).

What fruits might God be calling you to bear?

What "beams" might be in your eye, keeping you from seeing the truth of God?
