

## **Following Christ**

Throughout the narrative of Christ's Passion, Saint Luke weaves in the many ways people respond and react with Jesus. While Jesus is keenly aware of the sufferings he is about to go through, it is clear that everyone else have no concept of the strength and love that will be asked of them in the coming days.

Case in point is Peter. At the Last Supper, Peter is appalled at being told he will betray Jesus and desperately expresses his desire to be at Jesus' side. It is not as if Peter is lying. He simply does not comprehend the cost of his fidelity to Jesus. He cannot imagine how difficult it will be. Yet, the amazing thing is that Jesus accepts Peter's claims of loyalty and even goes on to predict the grace that Peter will provide his brothers, and the entire Church, once he turns back to Christ. Jesus accepts even the smallest attempt that Peter can give.

Each of us desires to respond to Jesus with fidelity and bravery, unafraid to be known as his friend and follower. Yet, we cannot adequately respond to the God who is totally self-giving love. Still, the Lord accepts our feeble efforts. It becomes all the more clear that our efforts to follow Christ are too weak to sustain us over the long haul. Only the immense love of God can help us here. If Jesus is truly the Son of God, then we must follow him without reserve.
