LIVING THE LITURGY **Condemnation or Forgiveness**

Usually, we begin celebrating the Mass with a Penitential Rite, recognizing our sins. We do this not to appease an angry God, but to remind ourselves of our own failings, our need for humility and forgiveness, so that we can be as merciful towards others as we hope God will be to us. Jesus has already taught us that God is always eager to forgive. He is not interested in condemnation. Instead, condemnation is a human preoccupation: something that we continue to do even though the Lord has taught us differently. Today, we have another reminder of the way God truly wishes to deal with us.

The Gospel Reading this Sunday presents this contrast between our harsh judgement and God's mercy in a very striking way. A self-righteous, terrible act is about to take place: blood will he shed and will be on the people's hands, even though they seem to welcome such a thing. The accused woman will surely suffer terribly, but all those caught up in the killing will also suffer the effects of their inhuman cruelty. Jesus' challenge saves the woman, and it also saves those who sought her life.

The scribes and Pharisees are forced to admit that they are more like the woman that they are unlike her. All are sinners in need of God's mercy. And God, through Jesus, is quick to offer that mercy, with its power to heal us. Saint Paul reminds us today this gift of God's love through Jesus Christ is more precious than anything else. All else is rubbish.

How have you experienced Jesus's forgiveness? How could you extend that forgiveness to others?
