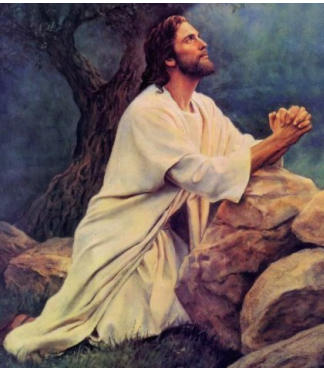

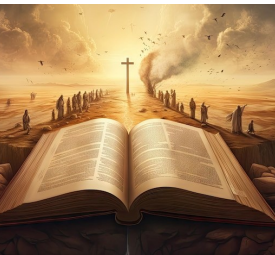

LIVING THE
LITURGY
Call To
Union

In the Gospel
Reading today,
Jesus concludes the long Discourse and Prayer that he
had with his disciples during the Last Supper. Before go-
ing out to the Garden of Gethsemane where he will be
arrested, Jesus speaks of the intimate union he has with
God the Father. Yet, the disciples are not simply left as
bystanders, witnessing this intimate union. The love of
God seeks out all on earth to be included in the sacred
embrace. Jesus prays that all of his disciples will know
and live in this wondrous love.
Jesus’ prayer is really a call that we who are already
completely united in God’s love for us may realize this
truth and begin to live and act accordingly. Realizing the
unity we have in God’s love should have a profound
effect not only how we treat one another, but also in the
ways we treat all of God’s creation.

This oneness that already binds us together is a gift from
God, and like all gifts, it can be accepted or rejected. Some-
times, people do reject it, thinking that they are not good
enough or are simply inadequate for God. Yet, in the Gospel
today, Jesus calls us, his disciples, the Father’s gift to him.
We are the wonderful gift from the Father to the Son in the
Holy Spirit. And Jesus was speaking primarily about a group
that never understood him, argued over who was greater,
betrayed him, and even afterwards continued to doubt and
argue. Who are we, then, to refuse to be God’s gift, and to
be unified in Christ?

Can you think of yourself as a gift to Jesus?
How might you make your life into a gift to him?
When forms of prayer or service help you experience
God’s presence in meaningful ways?
What forms of prayer or service are challenging for you?

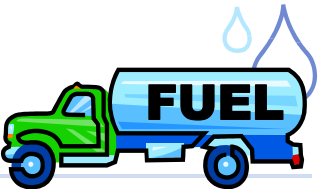


On Fathers’ Day,
