# LIVING THE LITURGY **Spending Your Life For Christ!**

Christian martyrdom is not something limited to the early church. In the last century we have seen the witnesses of Saint Titus Brandsma and Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, along with Saint Oscar Romero and many others who have died in Latin America in defense of our faith. To be a martyr is to be a witness to one's faith in death but also in life. Martyrdom is not something that is sought after; it is simply a consequence of living an authentic witness of the faith. Mindful of the risk, we seek to live as authentic witnesses of Jesus in our vocations, wherever we may find ourselves. Our vocation is a response of love to the God who first loved us.

Today Peter is called to a deeper authenticity in serving Christ Jesus. In place of his earlier denial, he is now asked to renew again his commitment to loving the Lord Jesus above all else. And when we look at how he acts in the first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, you can see that he is taking this new life very seriously. Peter is no longer afraid to boldly proclaim Christ Jesus to the world, even though it will ultimately cost him his life.

The love between Jesus and his own is both fruitful and costly. It is not a love that encloses the lovers and exclusive bubble of bliss. This love bears fruit, extending one outward into mission, feeding the hungers of those who are most vulnerable. It asks disciples to take a stance with arms outstretched, extended in prayer, and embrace of the Beloved and all his friends, in service to those in need, and in conformity to the outstretched arms of Christ who draws all people to himself.
