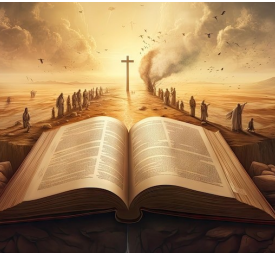

LIVING  
THE LITURGY  
Following Christ

Today is a solemnity because of the significance of both Peter and Paul, two of the most important figures in the early church. Who could have guessed that a Galilean fisherman and a Pharisee from Tarsus could change the course of world history? Together, these great Saints root the church firmly in the city of Rome – both ministered and were killed there – and are inseparable as leaders in the early church. They also offer proof that God qualifies the called rather than calls the qualified.

Are we willing to let an encounter with Jesus Christ transform our own lives, regardless of where that leads us? Wherever our journey of faith takes us, we can be consoled knowing that God chooses to love us and call us for mission as well. Like Peter and Paul, we might be called to some amount of suffering for Christ's sake. Jesus did, after all, tell us all to take up our crosses if we would be his disciples. We are not called to seek out unnecessary suffering, but when pain inevitably finds us, we can rest in the knowledge that Jesus has conquered. It is no longer suffering for its own sake; We do not hurt in vain. When we join our suffering with Christ, he can transform it into something life-giving and good.

In celebrating today's feast, we honor two people who lived in the service of Christ and his church, and we ask for their intercession in living lives fully committed to the gospel.

Where are you on your own faith journey?  
How do you find God present with you now?

What suffering have you had to endure for the sake of your faith? How has Jesus helped you get through it?
