God Among Us

Back at Christmas Time, we celebrated the presence of God among us in the tiny Baby

born in Bethlehem to Mary, betrothed of Joseph. The fullness of God was hidden in the all-too-human child named Jesus. Throughout the Gospel according to Saint John, Jesus reminds us that He was sent by the Father so that we can be in communion with the Father and share the life enjoyed by the Father and Son together. Now, at the conclusion of Easter Time, we celebrate the Lord Jesus, risen from the dead and living forever. We celebrated his Ascension into Heaven, returning to the Father. To complete the work of our redemption, the Holy Spirit is sent to be the continuing presence of God's abiding love among us.

The Readings today are filled with the signs of God's presence that we gained from the Old Testament: thundering noise such as what was heard on Mount Sinai, a whirlwind like that from which God spoke to Job, and fire such as Moses saw in the burning bush. All these are present as the Spirit came upon the early Church hidden away in the Upper Room. But the Gospel Reading gives us a new way of experiencing the Spirit: in a quiet and peaceful way, Jesus simply breathes on the apostles, and those who had been sad and listless at the death of Jesus are now given a new life more powerful than they have ever had before. This quiet infusion of the Holy Spirit is just as dramatic and powerful as the windy fire: no matter how we receive the Spirit, the Spirit changes us as it makes us aware of God's presence within us.
